The Third Forage: Dance and Choreography

Theatre, Film and Television Studies colleagues Margaret Ames, Sabine Sorgel and Louise Ritchie looked for traces of dance in CPR's International Theatre Collection (ITC) in **The Third Forage: Dance and Choreography** on **Tuesday May 25th** and instigated a discussion about dance historiography. Louise explored transmission of performance through the notation of folk dances in Cecil Sharp's books of 1915 and Margaret raised issues of translation (and untranslatability) in the dance notation of Rudolph Laban (and original German texts) whilst Sabine reflected on 'choreographic portraiture' in memorabilia of Anna Pavlova. Notes and images will be added to those already on CADAIR shortly and the **Fourth Forage** will see Stephen Greer, Alison Forsyth and Richard Allen investigate the ITC in October:

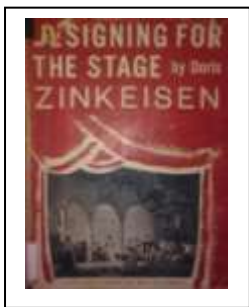
Performance Research Archive

Digitisation KESS Scholarship

CPR Collections has linked TFTS and the Department of Information Studies in a new KESS Mini scholarship with Digitisation Development at the National Library of Wales. Over the course of a year a postgraduate student will explore knowledge transfer opportunities between large and small scale collections and after training in digitisation at NLW will devise a digital strategy and training package for CPR's photographic collection under the supervision of DIS' Lucy Tedd, while cataloguing the Peter Hope Jones collection at NLW.

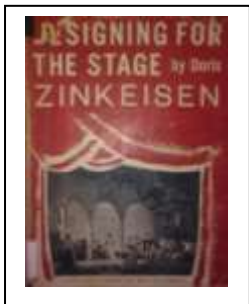


Ysgoloriaeth Digididdio KESS
