Section A requires an <u>examination essay</u> (50% of the total examination mark). Answer ONE of the eight questions.

- 1. Compare and contrast Plato's Philosopher King and Machiavelli's Prince.
- 2. What are the similarities and differences between Aristotle's idea of politics as friendship and Rousseau's general will?
- 3. Compare Locke's and Rousseau's social contracts.
- 4. Compare Hobbes's and Rousseau's concepts of the state of nature.
- 5. What are the key differences between Rousseau's and Kant's political theories?
- 6. What are the key differences between Mill's and Kant's political theories?
- 7. Compare how Locke and Mill address the majority–minority relations.
- 8. Does Machiavelli understand security similarly to Hobbes?

Section B requires an <u>examination essay</u> (50% of the total examination mark). Answer ONE of the six questions.

- 1. Compare and contrast Plato's and Aristotle's political theories. Which one is more attractive to modern people?
- 2. Is Machiavelli's political theory closer to his ancient predecessors or to his modern followers?
- 3. What is so revolutionary about Hobbes's concept of the social contract? Contrast it to ancient political theory.

- 4. 'Truly modern political theory starts only with John Locke, not Thomas Hobbes as some maintain'. Discuss.
- 5. Can modern political theory hold without its emphasis on reason as the Enlightenment would define it?
- 6. Is it a problem that some political theories are developed as pure or abstract theories and their practical applications necessitate compromises? Illustrate with references to two political theorists studied in the module.
