Index to Theses	An index of all theses (dissertations accepted for higher degrees) from Universities of UK and Ireland from 1716 to present. 44,000 abstracts are available for theses between 1970 to 1985
LISA	A worldwide searchable service containing fulltext coverage of most national UK newspapers and many regional ones as well as many foreign titles.
KnowUK	A platform providing access to the ISI Web of Science databases - Science Citation Index, Social Sciences Citation Index, and Arts & Humanities Citation Index and to the ISI Proceedings database.
EEBO	Librarianship, Information Science & Information Management.
Nexis	Online UK reference service providing access to over 100 reference sources which can be cross-searched or browsed/searched individually.
Web of Science	A full library of up-to-date, fully searchable criticism and reference resources in addition to the full text of poetry, drama, and prose fiction from the seventh century to the present day.
