Conventions

1. Exchanges are open to all PhD students.
2. There must be a research related reason for the proposed exchange (i.e. you want to work with a particular supervisor, use local resources, attend special workshops etc). The host department will nominate a shadow supervisor with relevant expertise in the area and students will be required to present their work in the relevant seminar series in the host department.
3. On their return to Aberystwyth, students are expected to produce a report indicating whether they have met the objectives listed in the original proposal.
4. Students will continue to be registered at their home institution and therefore pay fees to their home institution. Students will not pay tuition fees at their host institutions.
5. Students are responsible for their own travel and living expenses (including accommodation). Host departments will provide relevant information.
6. Medical and other related expenses are the sole responsibility of the student and it is strongly advised that applicants take out, where necessary, relevant private medical insurance. Students attending ANU are required to pay an Overseas Student Health Cover.
7. Students are responsible for obtaining any relevant visa and/or entry permits and should check the regulation with respect to their temporary entry status in the country of the host Department.
8. Students will pursue their research programme full-time while they are in the host Department. They will not undertake any paid teaching in the host Department nor will they be asked to do so. Students are expected to conform to the terms of their entry visa and will be required to conform to all the rules and regulations relating to students at the university they are visiting.
9. The host Department will endeavour to providing students with office space (usually shared), access to a networked computer, photocopying allowance, library access and other relevant facilities.
10. All exchanges are subject to approval by the graduate and research monitoring teams.
