#### Accentuate the positive

- Better marks for accurate and consistent referencing
- Collecting references building a bibliography to support the study of a whole degree and a dissertation
- Value for money for student fees a information skill gained, partners with critical thinking and the effective and efficient use of the library catalogues and structured online resources
- Fairness giving credit where it's due
- Authenticity good academic practice in the fight against fake news
- Scaffolding information skills for the future to support a higher degree or particular profession
- The strangely satisfying pleasure of exploring an idea through a trail of academic references

## Reading lists to support good academic practice

- Size matters: signpost not spoon-feed
- Structured: by week, theme, importance
- Arrange for weekly readings to be digitised
- Diverse /decolonised
- A variety of formats e.g. video, audio
- Involve students in source selection
- Updated and refreshed


