

Departmental context


Medium-sized department

Module Context


Linear history of 20th- and 21stcentury literary theory

Students drawn to earlier (seemingly less complex) Schools Guiding principles of the redesign



Uses seminars to model good practice in deploying theory in students' own critical practice

Introducing Ideas:


