- 2. Discuss the role of women in intelligence during the American Civil War, 1981-5.
- 3. How, and why, was intelligence integral to US victory in the Pacific War, 1941-5?
- 4. Assess the record of the FBI in countering internal 'opposition' groups and individuals from c. 1960-1975.
- 5. Assess the successes and failings of the US Intelligence Community (USIC) with regard to Cuba, 1959-62.
- 6. Did US intelligence agencies fail the policymakers in Washington DC during the Vietnam War? Or was the US Intelligence Community (USIC) just not listened to?
- 7. To what degree did the Reagan administration's use of the US Intelligence Community (USIC) to fight Soviet communism violate the norms established in the 'Year of Intelligence' (1975)?



- 8. What lessons did the US National Security State and the US Intelligence Community (USIC) learn from the 9/11 attacks? How did they seek to address any perceived shortcomings?
