SUSTAINABILITY & MODERN LANGUAGES

OUR 10 SUSTAINABILITY PLEDGES

1 TRANSPORT

We will commute by bike, scooter, walk or use public transport where and whenever possible. Our default option for conferences and academic travel will be public transport. We will make a conscious effort to avoid flying and will favour carpooling and more sustainable modes of travel for all university travel.

2 FOOD

Members of staff will aim to make conscious and sustainable choices when ordering and buying food on campus. We will purchase local and sustainable products and avoid palm oil or intensive CO2 footprints either from farming/producing or transport.

3 WATER

We pledge to not buy water in plastic bottles and to lobby for a completely plastic free campus that includes plastic free vending machines. We will not waste water and ask Estates to install more water fountains and/or water refill stations in and around Hugh Owen.

4 WASTE

We will act responsibly and not produce excessive paper waste or nonreusable/recyclable waste. We will not buy or use one-way plastic or non-reusable or noncompostable coffee cups and food containers. We will urge AU to dispose of noncompostable or non-recyclable cups and food containers.
