By overseeing the further development of research projects, facilities for postgraduates, and providing the Researcher Development Programme, careers enhancement programme, and training for teaching in Higher Education; our Graduate School will support all aspects of your time here and enhance your experience as a postgraduate student at Aberystwyth.

Our excellence in research is recognised through REF2014 (www.ref.ac.uk) and our involvement in a number of UK Research Council funded doctoral training collaborations. Full studentships are provided through these programmes and the Graduate School supports further development of such projects. The University also offers studentships through the AberDoc Scholarships Competition.

RESEARCHER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Our Researcher Development Programme aims to address the various aspects of the Vitae Researcher Development Framework (www.vitae.ac.uk). It contains a series of generic and subject-specific modules to help you complete your studies and further your career, and covers aspects such as ethics, quantitative and qualitative methods, public engagement, impact of research, writing school, viva preparation, and leadership. The Graduate School also runs an Advanced Research Methods programme, which covers bespoke subjects.

The Graduate School is committed to offering parts of its Development Programme through the medium of Welsh, although a full programme isn't available at this point in time. At present, these include settling-in and career development sessions. For more information, contact the Graduate School.

CAREERS ENHANCEMENT PROGRAMME

Our careers enhancement programme provides you with the support to link your studies with outside non-academic bodies. This programme covers a range of eMentoring and placement opportunities, and is strongly supported by the University's Career Service.

TEACHING IN HIGHER EDUCATION

To support postgraduate students who contribute to the teaching aspects of the University, we have developed a training programme, which provides you with a range of teaching skills, ranging from tutorials to lectures and assessment. In addition, CDSAP runs TPAU (Teaching for Postgraduates at Aberystwyth University), which is aimed to develop the teaching skills of postgraduate students who are teaching in their departments and is accredited by the UK Higher Education Academy (HEA) and those who complete the programme will become an Associate Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (AFHEA). The University is a strong supporter of the postgraduate employment charter.

The National Library of Wales welcomes Aberystwyth students to enjoy its facilities and to make use of the wealth of resources available. The Library is one of the UK's six legal deposit libraries which means that it has the right to a copy of any printed publication from the UK in whichever language or whatever subject.

Entrance and use of the Library is free and it is very simple for students to join as readers. All the

Library reading rooms offer a modern space and free Wi-Fi for all users.

As well as some 6 million books and magazines the Library also holds one and a half million maps, 950,000 photographs (including the oldest known photograph taken in Wales), the earliest Welsh manuscripts including the Black Book of Carmarthen and also priceless manuscripts such as Hengwrt Chaucer. It houses the Welsh Political Archive and the Screen and Sound Archive of Wales.

As well as the excellent academic facilities and collections the Library also hosts exhibitions, films, conferences, concerts, and talks are held at the Library's auditorium, the Drwm. The Library has an extensive selection of food at Caffi Pen Dinas and the shop offers a variety quality gifts and books.

PGCE Training at Aberyswyth

The School of Education offers postgraduate teacher training with QTS at Primary level and for the following Secondary subjects: Biology, Chemistry and Physics (each with Balanced Science), Mathematics, Modern Languages (French, German and Spanish), English, Geography, History and Drama. This is a new, integrated course devised and planned in partnership with schools. The course offers the opportunity to gain experience across two phases, enabling students to become knowledgeable and flexible practitioners. The majority of the course is school-based and students also complete their own research projects as well as learning about planning, classroom management and assessment. All subjects are offered in Welsh and English, with School Experience (teaching practice) arranged in schools which use the appropriate language.

Staff will be available to offer general advice about appropriate pathways into teacher training as well

as about the course itself, so if you are thinking of teaching but are not sure, please come and see us.

Advice, Information and Money Service

Our Student Advice, Information and Money Service provides support on a wide range of issues. Our Student Advisers who are accredited by The National Association of Student Money Advisers (NASMA) can also signpost you on any queries relating to accommodation, academic progress and University procedures.

Accessibility Service

The University is committed to maintaining a community that is accessible for everyone and welcomes applications from disabled students and those with specific learning differences. We advise you to consider before you apply the requirements of your chosen course and any elements that might present particular difficulties. We recommend that you visit the campus and department to investigate the support that may be available. Our Accessibility Advisers are delighted to help before you apply. We also recommend that you contact our Accessibility Advisers to discuss a study needs assessment and to get advice on grants, such as the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA). For eligible students our advisers can arrange support workers, including one-to-one study skills support, and individual examination arrangements may be available for students with a range of impairments including specific learning differences such as dyslexia and dyspraxia. Our Accessibility Service also provides support for care leavers.

We work closely with local GPs, hospital and mental health services, and are committed to supporting your health and emotional wellbeing throughout your studies.

Signpost is a friendly and confidential peermentoring scheme for all new undergraduates that offers one-to-one advice, to help you settle down to university life, plan for the future, and make the most of your time at university.
