The Emily Price Scholarship Terms & Conditions



- 1. The Emily Price Scholarship is available to a female undergraduate student starting Part 1 of an honour degree to study Mathematics, Physics, or a joint-honours degree in Mathematics/Physics.
- 2. Applicants must apply to Aberystwyth University via UCAS by the January deadline and must hold an eligible course at Aberystwyth University as their Firm choice through UCAS in order to be considered.
- 3. The Emily Price Scholarship is aimed at female students who can demonstrate academic promise and the passion for increasing the involvement of women in mathematics and/or physics; applicants are required to complete and submit the scholarship application form by 31st January in the year of entry to University.
- 4. Applicants may be required to attend a short interview to discuss their application during an Applicant Visiting Day in February or March.
- 5. The Awarding Panel will meet to decide upon the allocations in April; the decision of the Awarding Panel is final.
- 6. The value of the Scholarship is £500. The Scholarship is for one year only. The payments will be made in two equal instalments direct to the recipient's bank account. The amounts will be: December: £250, March: £250.
- 7. One Scholarship is available annually.
- 8. Applicants must not have been a degree student previously at any higher education institution.
- 9. The successful candidate will be expected to attend all lectures and attain and maintain a high level of academic performance and attendance, as determined by the Awarding Panel.
- 10. The successful candidate may be required to work with a designated tutor, the University academic departments, and the Development and Alumni Relations Office to promote the Scholarship and the impact it has had on their studies.
- 11. The Scholarship holder will be given the opportunity to be involved in either the Mathematics and/or Physics Departments outreach activities within schools and the local community; and activities that aim to increase the involvement of women in mathematics and/or physics.
- 12. The Scholarship holder will be required to maintain regular contact with their nominated personal tutor to ensure they are progressing to the best of their ability.
- 13. Unsatisfactory academic progress, or unsatisfactory progress in any of these areas, without good cause, will result in termination of the award.
- 14. Awards are only payable to students studying for a full degree at Aberystwyth (not transferring into years 2 or 3 of the course).
- 15. Payments for students who temporarily withdraw will resume from the start of the next full term in which they recommence their studies (any remaining payment from the term in which they withdrew will not be repaid).
- 16. Please note that if you become indebted to the University, Scholarship and Bursary payments will be withheld and set against any outstanding debt.
- 17. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies before 1 December, the entire first instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies between 1 December and 2 March, the entire second instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. Failure to repay any award in such an instance could result in a referral to the University's debt collection agency.
