The Gwyneth Evans Bursary Terms and Conditions



- 1. This bursary is open to Undergraduates only
- 2. Candidates must hold an offer from Aberystwyth University
- 3. Candidates must be able to provide evidence of living in financial hardship and were either born in Ceredigion or have lived in Ceredigion for the 3 years prior to making an application.
- 4. The bursary is worth £500 per year of study. Payments will be made in two equal instalments directly to the recipients' bank account. The amounts will be; £250 in December and £250 in March.
- 5. The Awarding Panel will meet to decide upon the allocations; the decision of the Awarding Panel is final.
- 6. The successful candidate will be expected to attend all lectures and attain and maintain a high level of academic performance and attendance, as determined by the Awarding Panel.
- 7. The successful candidate may be required to work with a designated tutor, the University academic departments, and the Development and Alumni Relations Office to promote the bursary and the impact it has had on their studies.
- 8. Payments will continue for the tenure of the award subject to continued eligibility.
- 9. Payments will not be made during years abroad, years in employment, sandwich years, repeat years, etc. Holders of the Scholarship will continue to receive the benefits as long as they are full-time students and satisfy these terms and conditions.
- 10. Awards are only payable to students studying for a full degree at Aberystwyth (not transferring into years 2 or 3 of the course).
- 11. Payments for students who temporarily withdraw will resume from the start of the next full term in which they recommence their studies (any remaining payment from the term in which they withdrew will not be repaid).
- 12. Please note that if you become indebted to the University, Scholarship and Bursary payments will be withheld and set against any outstanding debt.
- 13. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies before 1 December, the entire first instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies between 1 December and 2 March, the entire second instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. Failure to repay any award in such an instance could result in a referral to the University's debt collection agency.
- 14. The information contained in this document is only applicable to applicants who will undertake their studies in Aberystwyth, and does not apply to students studying franchised or validated programmes delivered by our partners.
