Mathematics Department Award Terms and Conditions



- 1. Applicants must be applying to study full-time for a degree in any undergraduate subject from the Department of Mathematics at Aberystwyth University. Awards are not payable to those transferring into years 2 or 3 of the course.
- 2. All applicants will be considered automatically. To qualify, applicants must either be in receipt of a University Entrance Scholarship in the relevant subject or achieve a grade A* in A-level Mathematics.
- 3. The number of awards available is variable, and allocations will be determined by the Department's Awarding Panel. The decision of the awarding panel is final.
- 4. Payments will continue for the tenure of the award subject to continued eligibility (payments are not made during repeat years).
- 5. Awards are retained provided an exam average of 70% or above is achieved in the relevant subject modules each year.
- 6. Unsatisfactory academic progress, or unsatisfactory progress in any of these areas, without good cause, will result in termination of the award.
- 7. Payments for this award are made through Aber Aspire. Students will receive an email notification from Aber Aspire when their funds are ready to access, along with guidance on how to withdraw them.
- 8. Awards are paid whilst students are registered as full-time and full fee-paying. Payments will not be made during years abroad, years in employment, sandwich years etc.
- 9. Students deferring their entry will be entitled to receive Scholarships/Bursaries at the level publicised for the year of application (rather than the year of entry in the case of deferred applications).
- 10. It is the award holders' responsibility to withdraw their funds before they expire. Any remaining balance that has not been withdrawn by the specified date will be unavailable, and you will no longer have access to those funds.
- 11. Payments for students who temporarily withdraw will resume from the start of the next full term in which they recommence their studies (any remaining payment from the term in which they withdrew will not be repaid).
- 12. Please note that if you become indebted to the University, Scholarship and Bursary payments will be withheld and set against any outstanding debt.
- 13. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies before 1 December, the entire first instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies between 1 December and 2 March, the entire second instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. Failure to repay any award in such an instance could result in a referral to the University's debt collection agency.
- 14. The information contained in this document is only applicable to applicants who will undertake their studies in Aberystwyth, and does not apply to students studying franchised or validated programmes delivered by our partners.
- 15. Aberystwyth University reserves the right to change or remove any of our current Scholarships, Bursaries and Financial Awards.
- 16. Failure to meet any of the above requirements will result in the Scholarship being withdrawn.
