


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

The Veterinary Education Centre is home to our veterinary courses.




The International Politics building houses the Departments of International Politics and History & Welsh History.

The Parry-Williams building houses the Departments of Welsh & Celtic Studies and Theatre, Film & Television Studies.




Located in the P5 building are the Departments of Psychology, Information Studies and the School of Education.

We are a member of a consortium of 20 UK universities to strike a £50M landmark green energy deal, reducing emissions and our carbon footprint as part of an aggregated purchase power agreement (PPA).



Over the past 10 years we have reduced our CO₂ emissions by 40%.



We have invested almost £7m over the last 4 years in energy efficiency measures.



We have invested £2.9 million in a new solar array with 4,500 solar panels that will reduce our CO₂ emissions by over 500 tonnes annually.



We have installed a range of electric car and bike charging points across our campuses.



We have recently installed a new sports dome with self-powered kit on campus to limit our carbon footprint.



We have wildflower meadows across our campus to enhance biodiversity.



We've completed Phase 2 of our tree planting scheme, with 16,000 native broadleaf trees planted across 3 sites. Once mature, this woodland is expected to enhance biodiversity and offset the University's carbon emissions by around 16 tonnes annually.



We regularly carry out a Biodiversity survey across our estate to help identify, protect and enhance the species and habitats around us.



We have a community garden on Penglais Campus for students and staff to learn about growing food and planting in a wildlife-friendly manner.

We have many free water refill stations across campus to reduce the need for single-use plastic bottles.



Research excellence

Aberystwyth is a research-led university which celebrates knowledge creation, impact, innovation and knowledge exchange.

Research underpins and informs our teaching and enhances your learning experience. You will be taught and mentored by staff who shape our understanding of the world and extend the frontiers of our knowledge, exposing you to the very latest thinking in your subject area.

Our research has benefits for wider society and impacts upon the economy, the environment, on public policy and upon cultural life in Wales and beyond. Through cultivating commercial partnerships, our research helps to develop new products, processes and techniques that can help us all live better lives.

Ranging from combatting climate change, improving food quality and food production, promoting human and animal health, to developing artificial intelligence and helping to advance space exploration, our researchers are at the forefront of innovation and the impact of our research has far-reaching international benefits.

Recent research initiatives

- Using 3D computer models and machine learning techniques to accurately predict what the outcomes of cleft lip palate surgery in children will look like in five or ten years' time.
- Using robotic and autonomous systems for observing biodiversity on land.
- Analysing stool samples from the dolphin population in Cardigan Bay using the latest environmental DNA (eDNA) techniques to extract detailed data on their diet.
- Documenting the facial movements of horses to better understand their emotions, social lives and wellbeing.
- Developing a mobile phone app that uses artificial intelligence to provide early warnings of diseases in potatoes.
- Developing new methods of controlling more effectively the parasitic worm which causes liver fluke infections in livestock.
- Developing a toolkit of practical measures which dairy farmers can choose to adopt in a bid to reduce their herd's carbon footprint.
- Creating educational resources for school pupils about Holocaust survivors and refugees who made Wales their home.
- Monitoring the success of the reintroduction of Britain's second rarest mammal, the pine marten.

Your degree

At Aberystwyth, we offer a range of undergraduate degrees. Many of our single honours degrees are also available with the option of an integrated foundation year, integrated year in industry, integrated year studying abroad or as Integrated Masters courses, allowing you greater flexibility in your study choices.

Bachelors single honours degrees

Enable you to specialise in one particular subject. Usually three years in duration, though language students will spend an additional year abroad.

Bachelors joint honours degrees

Enable you to study two subjects equally, with your time divided between two different departments. Usually three years in duration, our wide selection enables you to study complementary subjects, so you don't have to choose between your favourites.

Bachelors major/minor honours degrees

These provide you with a rigorous basis in one subject, with the advantage of pursuing an additional subject of interest to you. Usually three years in duration, you'll spend two-thirds of your time studying the major subject, and a third studying the minor subject.

Bachelors honours degrees with integrated year in industry

Usually four years in duration, you will spend your third year working in industry, before returning to Aberystwyth in your fourth year to complete your degree. The industrial year forms an assessed part of your course, and you may have the option to conduct your work placement abroad, should you wish to do so.

Bachelors honours degrees with integrated year studying abroad

Usually four years in duration, you will spend your third year studying abroad at one of our partner institutions, before returning to Aberystwyth in your fourth year to complete your degree. The year abroad forms an assessed part of your course.

Bachelors honours degrees with integrated foundation year

Designed for applicants who don't meet the typical entry requirements for the standard degree, the integrated foundation year enables you to develop the necessary academic skills to begin your chosen course in your second year. Your course will therefore be four years in duration rather than three, but your student loan will cover the additional year.

Integrated Masters degrees

These allow you to integrate three years of undergraduate study with a further year of postgraduate-level study leading to a Masters-level qualification. You can apply for a four-year student loan for the full duration of these degrees, rather than seeking additional funding for a Masters after completing your first degree.

Foundation degrees

Usually two or three years in duration, foundation degrees combine academic study with practical skills, which you can apply in the workplace. Successful completion can also lead to direct entry onto the final year of some courses. At Aberystwyth, we currently offer foundation degrees in Agriculture and Veterinary Nursing.

Your degree – how it works

- Your degree consists of a range of modules on different topics. Core modules are compulsory, but you can choose from a selection of optional modules, where available.
- You may be taught through a combination of lectures, seminars, tutorials, practicals, fieldwork or workshops, depending on your chosen course.
- Methods of assessment may include course work, exams, laboratory practicals, an evaluation of your contribution to group work and seminar presentations, and project work.

Studying through the medium of Welsh

At Aberystwyth University, we offer many opportunities for students wishing to study through the medium of Welsh. Some courses can be followed entirely through the medium of Welsh, while others offer Welsh-medium module options. Students can also choose to submit their work and sit their exams in Welsh, and have a Welsh-speaking personal tutor.

Why study through the medium of Welsh?

Financial benefit

The Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol offer a range of scholarships for students who study all or part of their course in Welsh. Students studying more than 5 credits in Welsh could also be eligible for our Welsh Medium Study Bursary.

Choice

The provision is flexible. Students can choose to study as many or as few of the Welsh-medium or bilingual modules that are available to them as they wish.

Small class sizes

Our Welsh-medium modules tend to have smaller class sizes, benefitting students and often leading to a better learning experience.

Employability

Studying in both Welsh and English means you develop academic skills in both languages, improving your career prospects and attractiveness to employers based in Wales.

Meeting your study needs



We continually invest in our facilities to ensure our students have access to modern and accessible resources.

The University has two libraries on campus, providing a range of study spaces and an extensive range of both printed and electronic materials to support teaching, learning and research across all subjects and departments. There is also a range of dynamic study spaces, including informal study lounges and bookable private rooms.

Fast, reliable wifi is available throughout the campus and halls of residence. Computers for student use are available in libraries and computer rooms across campus, in halls of residence and in town, many of which are accessible 24/7. These spaces include printers, with photocopying and scanning functions and monitor hubs for students to use with their own laptop. Other equipment is available for loan, for example voice recorders and video recorders to support your studies.

Blackboard, the University's Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) provides an online site for each course offering a range of materials to support learning and teaching. Through Blackboard, students can access resources such as lecture recordings, presentations and reading lists anytime, as well as submit their coursework.






Explore Aberystwyth



Aberystwyth is the perfect place for learning and for life. Our campus is only a short walk from the historic seaside town, which is often described as the cultural capital of Wales.

Literature and creativity in many forms, and in both Welsh and English, are an integral part of everyday life here, and Aberystwyth Ceredigion is designated Wales's first UNESCO Creative City and City of Literature.

Aberystwyth is a lively, welcoming and inclusive town, well-known for its friendly atmosphere. With shops, cafes, restaurants, and bars at every corner, it's a true student town. Offering plenty of vibrant spaces to explore, unwind and relax, Aberystwyth provides an unparalleled student experience. It was also the first town in Wales to be awarded the Purple Flag for its safe and welcoming nightlife.



The Victorian promenade stretches for 2km along Aberystwyth's seafront, making it the perfect spot to stretch your legs and catch the sunset. At the far end of the prom, Constitution Hill (known as 'Consti' by locals) offers an epic view of the entire town and seafront.

Between the 19th-century Royal Pier, famous for its spectacular starling murmurations at dusk, and the 12th-century medieval castle, stands the Old College - a Grade One architectural landmark and the birthplace of the first University College of Wales. This iconic building is currently being transformed into a major cultural and creative hub for Wales.

The National Library of Wales is a valuable resource for students. With over 6.5 million books and periodicals, it houses the country's largest collections of archives, portraits, maps and photographic images, offering an extensive wealth of material for research and discovery.

Situated between the Cambrian Mountains and Cardigan Bay, Aberystwyth is surrounded by a rugged landscape of hills, valleys, sand and sea. It's a great base for outdoor activities like hiking, biking, surfing and swimming, and the National Parks of Eryri (Snowdonia), Pembrokeshire coast and Bannau Brycheiniog (Brecon Beacons) are all within easy reach, making them perfect for a day trip.


Sports facilities

Supporting our students

Our students' wellbeing is a priority at Aberystwyth University and we offer a range of services to support our students. We offer advice and guidance on academic matters, financial concerns, physical and emotional difficulties, and more.

Personal Tutors

Each student is allocated a personal tutor who is an academic member of staff based in the student's department. The role of the personal tutor is to:

- help the student settle into life at Aberystwyth
- discuss and guide their academic progress
- support and encourage them during their studies.

Student support and wellbeing

Our team of expert advisers provide a safe, confidential space where students can talk about any issues which might be affecting their ability to study. Our Support Services include:

Advice and Money Service

Providing support on a wide range of issues, including finances, academic progress and university life.

Accessibility Service

Making university life accessible to everyone, with support for disabled students, those with specific learning needs, care leavers and other unsupported individuals such as trans and non-binary students.

Student Wellbeing Service

Using solution-focused techniques to build students' resilience and help them manage their wellbeing while at university and beyond.

Visa and Immigration Advice

Providing specialist advice on study visas for prospective and current international students.

Nightline

An independent listening service run by students for students, offering a confidential helpline, email and instant messaging service.

Accommodation support

In our accommodation, our dedicated team of Residence Assistants (RAs) are fellow students who provide support and guidance, with the aim of creating a positive living and learning environment. If the RAs are unable to help, they will signpost to someone who can.



Careers and employability

We aim to ensure our students graduate with the academic, professional and practical experience to help them stand out in the job market and secure meaningful employment.

Our Careers & Employability Service is on-hand to offer support and guidance on developing skills, gaining professional experience and applying for positions.

The Service:

- Provides support in developing CVs, applying for positions and interviewing
- Holds large careers events where students can meet potential employers
- Runs employability workshops and a dedicated Career Readiness Support programme
- Assists students to explore entrepreneurship and enterprise
- Provides support and guidance, post-graduation, for a set period.

Work experience

A number of courses offer an integrated year in industry and students can access the Careers Service's Year in Employment Scheme, both of which provide learners with relevant professional experience that complements their studies. The Service can also assist in identifying shorter-term work experience opportunities, such as summer internships, work placements and part-time employment.

The University has industry links with a range of local, national and international employers, enabling our students to connect with leading employers across sectors.

English language support

Pre-sessional English courses

Our pre-sessional English courses are designed to improve your English language and academic study skills before you start your degree at Aberystwyth University. If you have an offer of a place on a degree programme but have not met the English language entry requirement, you can take one of our pre-sessional courses.

The University offers 6 or 12-week courses, either in-person or online. The length of course you need depends on your current level of English Language, and the entry requirement of your department.

A pre-sessional course gives you the opportunity to develop your academic English, settle into Aberystwyth University and make friends so that you can begin your degree with confidence. Students can choose to take a pre-sessional course even if they have an unconditional offer for their degree.

International Foundation Programme

The International Foundation Programme is designed for students who have completed high school in their own country but do not have the qualifications to begin a British degree. If you studied in a country with a 12-year education system, you will probably need to complete our International Foundation Programme before progressing to your Aberystwyth degree programme.

On the International Foundation Programme you will study academic English, subject-specific modules and UK study skills in a friendly and supportive environment. Successful completion of the course guarantees progression to your chosen degree.

Students can opt to study on 1 of 4 International Foundation pathways:

- Business, Economics and Finance
- Computer Science and Technology
- Humanities and Social Sciences
- Science and Engineering.

Entry requirements:

- Age 17+
- Successful completion of high school to a level that indicates likely success on the International Foundation Programme.

Proof of English language is required, either providing an IELTS for UKVI certificate or an equivalent Secure English Language test.

English language requirements vary depending on your chosen pathway.

International Foundation Programme pathway	Minimum IELTS for UKVI required
Business, Economics & Finance	4.5 (with no score below 4.0)
Computer Science & Technology	4.5 (with no score below 4.0)
Humanities & Social Sciences	5.0 (with no score below 4.5)
Science & Engineering	6.5 (with no score below 6.0), or 5.5 with a 12-week Pre-sessional English programme*.

*You must successfully complete a 12-week Pre-Sessional before beginning the pathway if you have an IELTS score of less than 6.5.

Fees and finance

Tuition fees

Your tuition fees cover the cost of your study at university, and include charges for things like examinations and graduation.

Fee levels will differ depending on whether you are a UK or international student. For international students, fees can also vary depending on whether you are studying an Arts/Social Sciences subject or a Science subject.
