Dear Student,

Welcome to the Computer Science Department and to Aberystwyth University! You are now a member of our department, and we hope you will soon feel at home here. We are a friendly and supportive department, and if there is anything you are unsure of as you settle into university, or at any time during your studies, please contact your personal tutor or any other member of staff (including me) and we will do our best to help you.

This guide is intended to introduce you to the main points of contact for your first year and to let you know what is going on in the first few weeks. One of the first and most important points of contacts is your personal tutor, not only in the beginning but through you whole time at Aberystwyth University. Your personal tutor will often be the best person to speak to when you have any questions or problems. In particular in the beginning other important people for your induction are the First Year Coordinator (Edore Akpokodje), and the Academic Advisors (Patricia Shaw and Andy Starr), and the First Year Activity Weekend Organiser (Thomas Jansen). In the Welcome Week you will be introduced to the department and will need to select your modules.



We believe an important element in succeeding at university is having a network of supportive peers within the department. This is even more true in Computer Science, a discipline where working together with other people is very important. The first-year activity weekend is designed to help you to get to know the other first year students, while having fun tackling some team-based problem solving activities. Teamwork and problem solving are both crucial skills for computer scientists.

We are moving back towards teaching how it was before the pandemic, but we will keep the things that proved to be useful. Among them is the use of Discord, in particular a community Discord server that our students have set up during the pandemic. It has become an important part of the life in our department, for students and staff alike. Join it, introduce yourself and use it as an additional opportunity to stay in touch. Arguably more important than online contact is face to face contact. Make sure you have as much as you can and, most importantly, please make sure you do not miss any face to face teaching sessions. While we create recordings that you can watch if you have to miss a session they are only a poor replacement for actually being in the room and participating.

Like most things in life that are worth doing, gaining a good degree from the Computer Science department in Aberystwyth is not easy to achieve and you will have to work hard to succeed. It will be worth it because it is a fantastic asset that will give you important transferable and specialised skills, valued by employers in a range of future careers. And also like most things in life, the more you put into your time here the more you will get out of it. Please, engage with your studies, pester your lecturers for more information or when you need help, join clubs and societies, make friends and embrace everything the town has to offer.

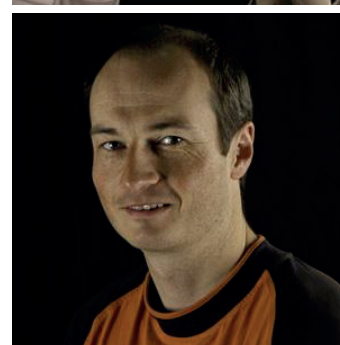
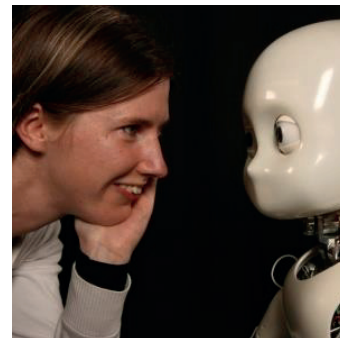
